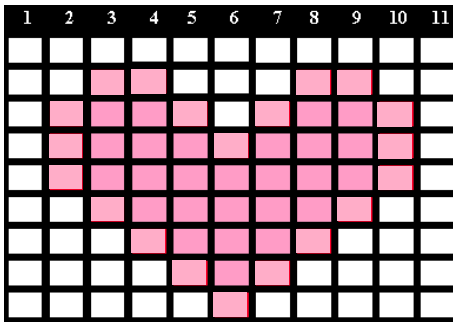


Circle Head of Pin



Point Head of Pin

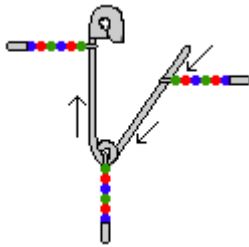
Open a safety pin, and slip the seed beads onto it. Once all beads are in place, close the safety pin. You may want to use the needle-nose pliers to pinch the end of the safety pin so it will not pop open later. Repeat this step until all the safety pins are beaded.



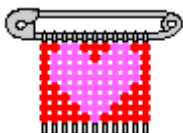
Now you are ready to put all the beaded pins onto a larger safety pin. Open the large safety pin. Use the flat-head screwdriver to slightly pry apart the coils at the end of the large pin. (Liz: This is where I use a table knife)



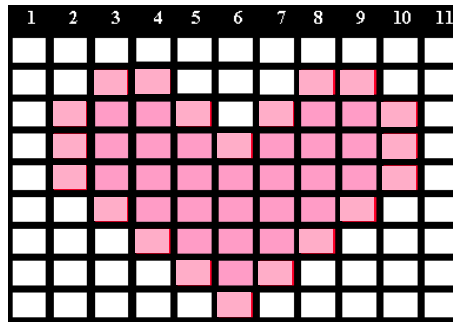
