Do Girl Scouts today do the same kinds of service projects that Girl Scouts 50 years ago did? Do you think Girl Scouts 50 years from now will be doing the same kinds of service??

Girl Scouts used to establish seven days of service during Girl Scout Week. For example, about 50 years ago, in 1954:

- Girl Scout Sunday and Girl Scout Sabbath (Saturday) was a time girls attended services at their house of worship.
- Monday was designated Homemaking Day.
- Tuesday was Citizenship Day.
- Wednesday was Health and Safety Day.
- Thursday was International Friendship Day
- Friday was Arts and Crafts Day (and Girl Scout Birthday!).
- Saturday was Outdoors Day.



- 1** If possible, find someone who was a Girl Scout 50 years ago. Ask her what type of service she might have performed on each of those days! If you can't find a former Girl Scout, ask a grandparent or another person!
- 2** Then, together, or by yourself, imagine how a Girl Scout 50 years from now might perform service on each of those days. Use your imagination!!
- 3** Finally, think of what you can do today. Do at least one of the ideas you come up with!

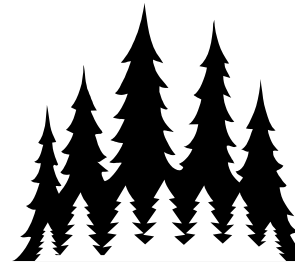
Outdoors Day

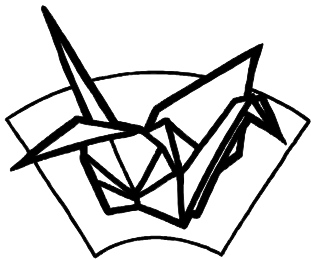
Arts & Crafts Day

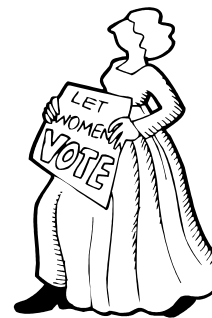
Citizenship Day

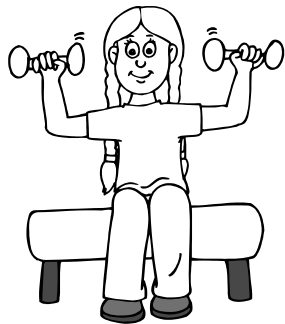
Health & Safety Day
