

# TAKING THE TROOP ON AN OUTING!

**Rules:** Roll the dice and move your Hershey Kiss the the correct number of spaces. If you land on an UH-OH! or WOO HOO! space, draw that card! How do you win?? Making it through the outing! *Be sure to have extra Kisses on hand!*

The board game layout consists of a path of 25 circles arranged in a winding pattern from left to right. The path starts with a circle labeled 'START' at the bottom left. The path then winds upwards and right, then downwards and right, then upwards and right, then downwards and right, and finally upwards and right to end at a circle labeled 'END' at the far right. Two boxes labeled 'UH-OH! Cards' and 'WOO HOO! Cards' are positioned at the top left and top right of the board, respectively. The board is surrounded by many empty circles, representing the spaces a Hershey Kiss can move to.
